

The Little Sand Lake Area Association (LSLAA) is happy to have you as a neighbor! And, if you aren't already a member of LSLAA, we hope you will join. This information "packet" will introduce you to LSLAA and our lake community. The Lake

Little Sand Lake is one of 124 lakes (greater than 10 acres) in Hubbard County, Minnesota. At 410 acres, it is a medium size lake with a maximum depth of 80 feet, and average depth of 22 feet and 6.4 miles of shoreline. There are approximately 162 privately owned parcels on the lake. There is a public boat launch on the southeast side of the lake; it is on Glacier Drive off of CR 50. Little Sand Lake is among the cleanest, clearest lakes in the state; while clarity varies depending



on time of year and weather conditions, clarity has been recorded as deep as 40 feet.

Whether you're a seasonal, weekender, or fulltime resident, Little Sand has a lot to offer. Fishing is a favorite activity year-round. Anglers can expect to find a variety of fish including Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Pumpkinseed, Rock Bass, Smallmouth Bass, Walleye, Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Brown Bullhead, Yellow Bullhead and Yellow Perch. Other fish species in the lake include Cisco (Tullibee), Common Shiner, Hybrid Sunfish and White Sucker. With multiple bays, it is ideal for water sport activities or just anchoring the pontoon offshore. Little Sand is part of a chain of lakes that starts with Big Mantrap, includes the Bottle Lakes and Big Sand and ends at Lake Belle Taine; depending on water depth, other lakes in the chain can usually be accessed via small watercraft. Additionally, there are more than a dozen lakes within a five-minute drive.

Dorset, the "Restaurant Capital of the World," is within three miles of any point on the lake. Little Sand Lake also hosts the Zorbaz of Park Rapids restaurant. You can get there by car or watercraft to Zorbaz, and you can join your lake neighbors the last Monday of every month at 5PM for "Zorbaz Night." In addition to several excellent restaurants in Dorset, you can

Neighborhoods

Little Sand Lake has 17 sections or neighborhoods as shown on the map to the right.

Geography

Hubbard County is in the northern most section of the Mississippi Water basin which drains south to the Gulf of Mexico. It is also at the confluence of three watershed districts (Mississippi River, Leech Lake River and Crow Wing River). The county has an average elevation of 1,526 ft. above sea level.

Forests synonymous with the 'north woods' and boreal forests. As you go east and north of here, the forests become denser and are dominated by aspen, spruce, pine and fir. To the west and south are Eastern Broadleaf Forests with more hardwoods and pockets of grassland prairies like the Hubbard Prairie, near Hubbard, and the Ponsford Prairie 25 miles northwest.

We are in the 3B growing region for plant hardiness zone which means that average annual extreme temperatures are -30 to -35

degrees below zero F. Hardiness zones are a great guide for determining which perennials, shrubs, and trees will survive in our area.

County

Hubbard County was established in 1883 and named for Lucius Frederick Hubbard, the 9th Governor of Minnesota. The county is 1,000 square miles and has a population of 21,344 (2021census). This is an increase of about 6% over 10 years. Park Rapids is the largest city with a population of 4,026.

Little Sand Lake Area Association

Little Sand Lake Area Association (LSLAA) was formed in 1988. LSLAA is a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization. Our mission is *"...to promote a sense of community among Little Sand Lake residents through social events, information-sharing, and collective action on issues important to all of us*." Issues important to all of us include water safety and maintaining a healthy lake. We have volunteers who monitor lake quality and check for aquatic invasive species (both vegetation and animal). Our Social Committee coordinates many opportunities for our residents to get together. Most social events are scheduled for the summer, and except for Boardsponsored events, they are participant-funded; a very small part of your dues goes toward social activities. Our Board members and Officers serve voluntarily, and the association does not support or promote any political or activist positions; however, we do share information about issues and events that that may affect our Little Sand Lake properties.

The majority of our residents and LSLAA members are seasonal residents. We do have LSLAA members who are not residents but love our beautiful lake and wish to support our efforts.

Dues are \$50 per property per calendar year. In addition to dues, LSLAA relies on additional donations from our members. Dues and donations are tax deductible, can be paid online at <u>Annual Dues - Little Sand (littlesandlakemn.com)</u>, and go towards:

- Membership in Hubbard County Coalition of Lake Associations (HCCOLA)
- Watercraft Inspections at the Public Launch (LSLAA's largest expense)
- Water Testing and Monitoring Equipment and Lab Testing
- Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Contingency Fund (Emergency Fund should Little Sand Lake be infested with an AIS)

LSLAA Board-Sponsored Events: Annual Meeting is held in June; Annual Picnic is usually held late July/early August; Fishing Contest in August (Note: Minimal amounts from the budget go toward these events, as they are mostly funded and supported through donations from local businesses.)

HCCOLA was formed in 1988. Its mission is to protect and enhance the quality of our lakes and rivers, preserve the economic, recreational and natural environmental values of our shorelands and promote the responsible use of our waters and related habitats.

HC COLA provides collaboration among member lakes in Hubbard County. Each member lake association has a voice on the HCCOLA through its COLA representative. The organization meets the last Thursday of the month during the months of April to November. LSLAA Board, Activities, and Resources

The LSLAA Board include elected President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and one (1) or more Board members (or Directors at Large) to represent each twenty-five (25) members. With the exception of the Treasurer, each Board member serves a term of two years with a maximum of two terms. The immediate Past President also serves as a voting member of the Board.

Annual Meeting: The Annual Meeting takes place the second Saturday in June each year. For the convenience of our members, it is held at Zorbaz with registration and social time starting at 8:00AM and the meeting starting at 8:30. This venue and schedule has been established so that our members can get back out and enjoy their Saturday at the lake!

Annual Picnic:

The Annual Picnic, usually held in late July/early August, features a potluck meal and a theme (e.g., pirate, Hawaiian, '50s, Western, etc.). We always have a fun time and a great turnout!
